

Morgan Raid Claims.

Act of Ohio Legislature, passed April 26, 1869.

THE STATE OF OHIO, MEIGS COUNTY, SS.

On this 14th day of May A.D. 1869, personally appeared before me, Charles of the Cincinnati Clear Court in and for the County and State aforesaid, Robert McElhinney of Butland in the County of Meigs, and State of Ohio, aged 52 years, who, being duly sworn, says that the affiant is the identical Robert McElhinney who presented to, proved before, and caused to be allowed by the "Commissioners to examine claims growing out of the Morgan Raid" appointed by the Governor of Ohio, under the Act of the General Assembly of the State of Ohio, passed March 30, 1864, the following claims referred to and numbered in the report of said Commissioners to the Governor aforesaid, as follows, to wit:

Property taken, destroyed or injured by the rebel forces, during the Morgan Raid of 1863, in Meigs County, Claim No. 220 \$ 220.00
Property taken, destroyed or injured by the Union forces during the Morgan Raid of 1863, in Meigs County, Claim No. _____ \$ _____

That neither this affiant, nor any person for this affiant, has received any pay or compensation from the United States, or any other source whatever, for the whole or any part of said claim. And this affiant further says that this affiant has not bartered, sold, assigned, transferred, exchanged or given away said claim nor any part thereof.

This application is made to recover the amount of said claim, under the act of the General Assembly of Ohio, passed April 26, A. D., 1869. And said applicant desires all communications and the warrant for pay to be sent to W. H. Lasley, of Pomeroy, Meigs County, Ohio.
