KNOW YE, That by virtue and in consideration of a *Warrant from the Monroe County Court*

there is granted by the said Commonwealth, unto *J. S. Page*

a certain TRACT OR PARCEL OF LAND, containing *twenty five* acres, by survey,

bearing date the *17<sup>th</sup>* day of *October* one thousand eight hundred and *forty eight* lying and being in the County of *Monroe* on the head waters of *Blacks Creek* and bounded as follows: *beginning on the dayward corner to Page and Monroe and with Monroe line East 66 feet to a double white oak and dayward thence with the same S 20 feet to two hickories and paper S 33° W 98 feet with the line and to a creek and bridge on Williams line and with his line N 20 feet to a white oak and two black gums corner to Page and with his line N 5° East 100 feet to the beginning.*

with its appurtenances: To HAVE AND TO HOLD the said TRACT OR PARCEL OF LAND, with its appurtenances, to the said *J. S. Page*

and *his* heirs forever.
