Bretheren James Wilson (Majr) Dudley Rountree, Nathan Heatherly, Joshua Woosley & Mathias Reynolds appointed a committee to inquire in to the conduct of Sister Elizabeth Orsbourn and report-- The committee report that they find from proof and her own acknowledgement that she has been guilty of very immoral & unchristian like conduct, and that she is ripe for exclusin. She is therefore excluded.
5. Reference against Bro. Slemmons taken up. Viz, for going to law with the Bretheren. Bro Slemmens stated he, to get his own paper had given up Acct. & to Mr. Young who was rented in his name without his advice to do so, the Church is satisfied.

1. Sister E. Reynolds applied for a letter of dismissal and it was granted.
