Sir and Madam:

The claim filed by Mary A. Wilson, as the widow of Ansel Wilson, late private and waggoner, Cos. E & C, 17th Ky. Inf., has been examined. The records show that a claim filed by the soldier was disallowed March 30, 1911, as follows: "He was paid \$100. bounty under Act of July 22, 1861 pay and clothing to date of discharge, less for period absent, and travel allowances. Subsequently he was paid \$50.00 additional bounty under Act of July 28, 1866, all to which entitled for the reason that his service for bounty purposes was reduced to less than three years, by absence without proper authority.

The records show him to have been absent in desertion from Nov. 9, 1862 to June 19, 1863. He was overpaid to Oct. 31, 1863, an amount in excess of all possible credits. The claim is not affected by Act of Mar. 4, 1907."

Nothing further is now due.

Herewith is transmitted a certificate No. 821,928, for Original pension, issued in your favor, accompanied by a voucher.


You should execute the voucher in accordance with the printed instructions, and return it to the Commissioner of Pensions, and there will be sent to your address a check for the pension due.
