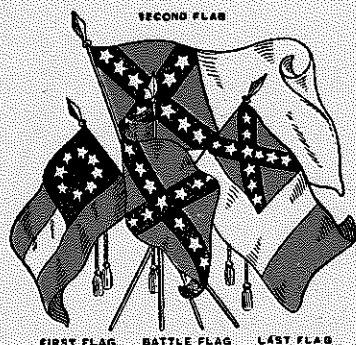

### GENERAL ORDERS

#### No. 4

I. Having accepted the invitation by the people of the good City of New Orleans, and of the State of Louisiana, our annual Convention and Reunion will be held in the City of New Orleans, Louisiana, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday, April 11th, 12th, and 13th, 1923.

II. For Railroads East of the Mississippi River, rates have been established, with conditions as follows:

Dates of Sale: April 7th, 8th, and 9th, and for trains scheduled to reach New Orleans prior to noon of April 10th, from Alabama, Florida, Georgia, South Carolina, Mississippi, Louisiana, and Helena, Arkansas.

April 6th, 7th, 8th, and 9th, from Virginia, West Virginia, North Carolina, Tennessee, and Kentucky, including Cincinnati, Ohio; Washington, District of Columbia; Evansville, Indiana, and Cairo, Illinois.

Final Limit, of all tickets, April 30th, prior to midnight, of which return trip must be complete.

Tickets sold only on presentation of identification certificates to Ticket Agents at time of purchase.

Two separate and distinct forms of identification certificates will be used:

Pink paper for Confederate Veterans and immediate members of their families.

Blue paper for Sons of Confederate Veterans, Confederate Southern Memorial Association, Daughters of the Confederacy, and Sponsors, Matrons, and Maids of Honor.

Form of Ticket: No signature required. Not transferable. No validation required.

Stop-overs will be allowed, on application to Conductors, at all points, within final limit, either going or coming.

Children, five years of age and under twelve, to be charged one-half of the adult fare.

Cars parked for occupancy at New Orleans, charged for on basis of \$12.00 per day.

III. Railroads West of the Mississippi River will charge one first-class fare for the round trip, for members of the United Confederate Veterans, Sons of Confederate Veterans, Confederate Southern Memorial Association, United Daughters of the Confederacy, Sponsors, and Maids of Honor. Fares to apply only to members of the Organizations named, and to their families, upon surrender of identification.

IV. We understand that some Veterans, such as are absolutely unable to pay railroad fare, railroads would be permitted to transport free of charge.

V. Our Convention will be called to order at 10 o'clock A. M., Wednesday, April 11th, 1923.

The Confederate Southern Memorial Association always holds its Annual Meetings at the same time and at the same city where we meet, and therefore will meet in New Orleans, Louisiana, April 11th, 12th, and 13th, 1923.

VI. Precisely at 12 o'clock noon, Thursday, April 12th, the second day of the Convention, the regular joint "Memorial Service" will be held for one hour, under the joint control of the United Confederate Veterans and the Confederate Southern Memorial Association.

This solemn and beautiful service, in memory of our heroic dead, has been annually observed ever since the organization of the Confederate Southern Memorial Association in 1900.

The present rapid falling away of our ranks renders additional interest in it, in honoring all who have gone before.

VII. At 10 o'clock A. M., Friday, the Organizations will begin the formation for the Grand Parade, which is to start promptly at 11 o'clock A. M.

The local Committee will give timely printed notice for the formation, the route of the Parade, etc.

VIII. The General Commanding is hoping for a great meeting at New Orleans, Louisiana, and will be pleased to have every member who is physically able to be there, to meet as comrades, and mingle in fraternal fellowship.

The reaper is gathering us in so rapidly for the long journey to the beyond that we realize that for many this may be the last Reunion they can attend.

IX. With thankfulness to Almighty God for the health, strength, and years of life which we have been blessed with, we can best show our appreciation by such exemplary conduct as would merit the approval of the great Generals under whom we served, if they could be here present with us. In their honor, and in the name of Him who served and sacrificed, let us meet with brotherly love, each one for all.
