**TO ALL WHO SHALL SEE THESE PRESENTS, GREETING:**

Know Ye, That reposing special trust and confidence in the patriotism, valor, fidelity and abilities of Mary S. Bledsoe  
 I do hereby appoint him Third Sergeant in Company E of the 26th Regiment of Kentucky Vol. Infantry  
 in the service of the UNITED STATES, to rank as such from the 29th day of July one thousand eight hundred and  
Sixty Three. He is therefore carefully and diligently to discharge the duty of Third Sergeant by doing and performing all manner  
 of things thereunto belonging. And I do strictly charge and require all Non-Commissioned Officers and Soldiers under his command  
 to be obedient to his orders as Third Sergeant. And he is to observe and follow such orders and directions, from time to time, as he  
 shall receive from me, or the future Commanding Officer of the Regiment, or other Superior Officers and Non-commissioned Officers  
 set over him, according to the rules and discipline of War. This warrant to continue in force during the pleasure of the Commanding  
 Officer of the Regiment for the time being.

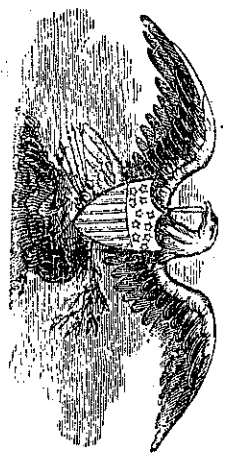

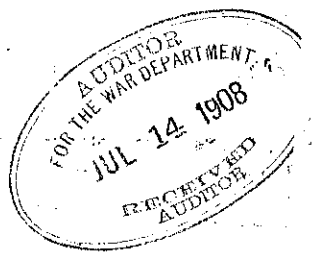

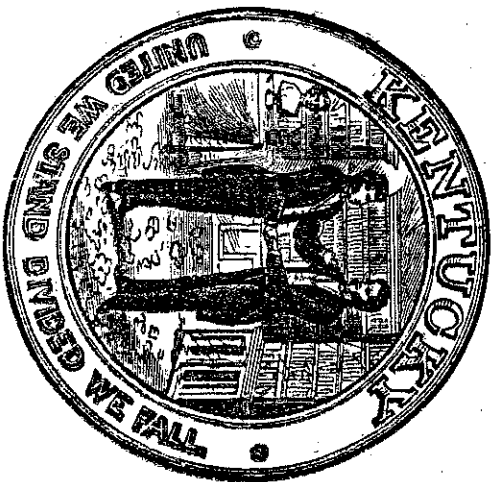

Know Ye, That Henry Bradley having been duly appointed by me of Caplain Company Service 2d. Ill. Regt. Provisional in the office of

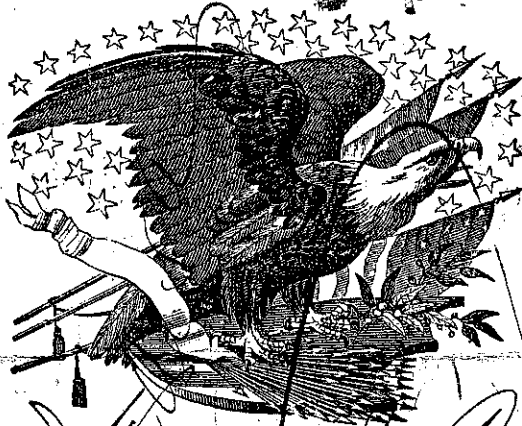
in the 2d. Infantry Regiment of Benjamin Slaughter militia, organized under the acts of the General Assembly of the Commonwealth, and to be inserted into the service of the United States

NOW KNOW YOU, That, by the powers vested in me by the Constitution and Laws of said State, and relying special trust and confidence in your patriotism, valor, fidelity, and ability, I do, by these presents Commission you as Caplain as aforesaid, for the term of three years unless sooner discharged, upon condition that you take the oath indorsed hereon, within ten days from receipt hereof, sending a certificate thereof to General Headquarters; and I do hereby authorize and require you to discharge, all and singular, the duties and services appertaining, to your said office, agreeably to laws and general regulations, and to obey such orders and instructions as you shall, from time to time, receive from your superior officers.

In Testimony Whereof, I have hereto set my name, and caused the seal of the State of Kentucky to be affixed, at Frankfort, this twentieth day of March, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty five and in the eighty ninth year of the Independence of the United States of America.
