presents shall come, Greeting : KNOW YE, that by virtue and consideration of a certificate in right of Settlement given by the Commissioners for adjusting the titles to unallotted Land in the District of Kentucky and in consideration of the ancient composition of two pounds Sterling paid by Boone into the Treasury of the Commonwealth there is granted by the said Commonwealth unto the said Squire Boone a paige of Richard Breckinridge

a certain tract or parcel of Land, containing four hundred acres by Survey bearing date the 27 day of January 1783 lying and being in the County of Jefferson on both sides of Fox Run a branch of Brushy Creek and bounded as followeth (Town) Beginning at Sarah Boons West line of two hundred and fifty acre tract at two Sugartrees thence North two hundred and fifty three poles to a black oak and two Sugartrees thence West two hundred and fifty ^{three} poles to two Sugartrees thence South two hundred and fifty three poles to two Sugartrees thence East two hundred and fifty three poles to the Beginning

With its appurtenances ; TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract or parcel of Land, with its appurtenances, to the said
