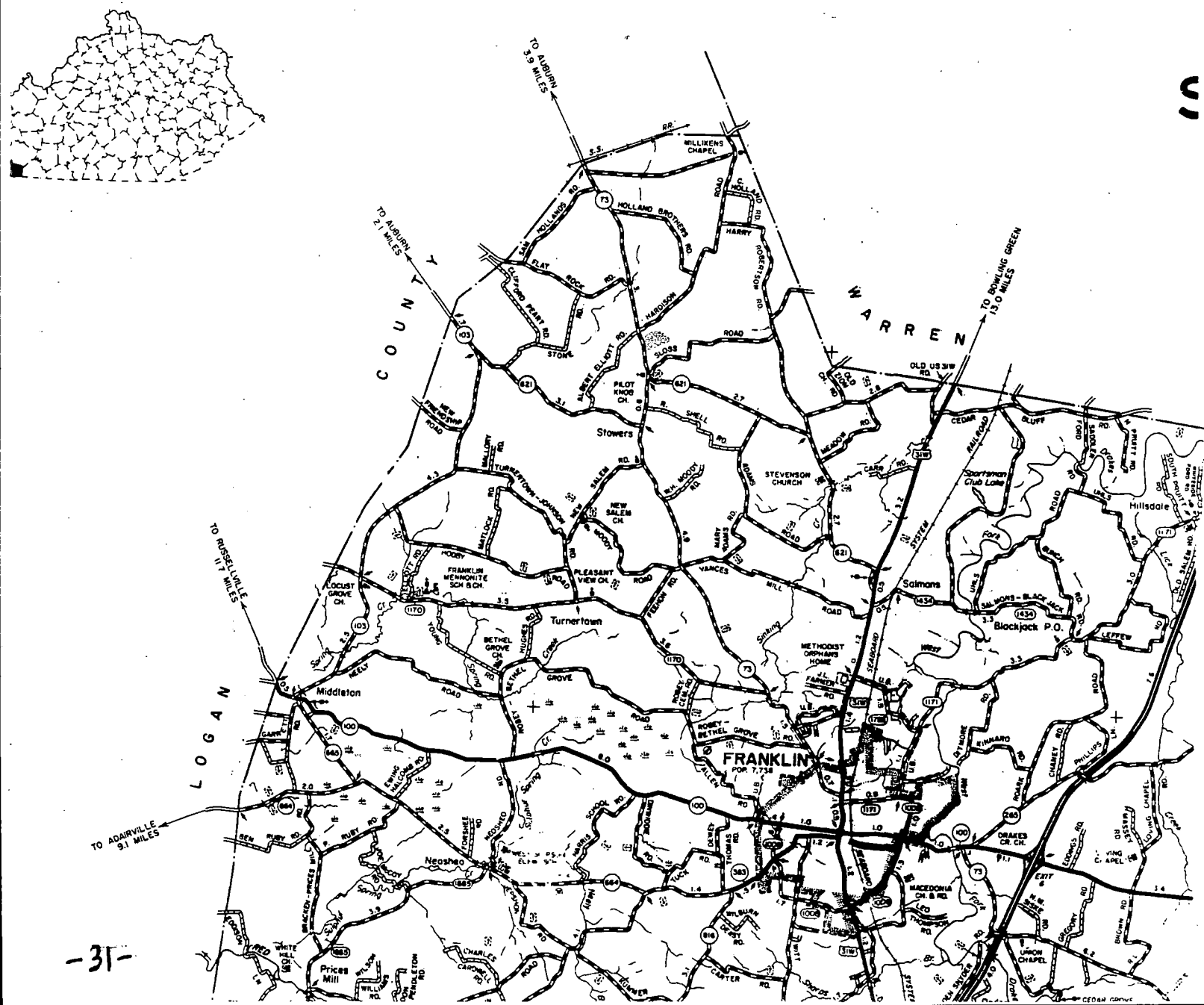

(004) I believe Mr. Cook bought the house but I do not know him. I did not live in the log house, I lived in the frame house. The house I lived in is on the left, it is a little frame house. I do not know who lives there now, a Hughes may have lived there but I think it is rented out. It was our homeplace, my mom, dad, and the children lived there.

I was born in Warren County. My older brother and sister were born in Logan and my middle sister in Simpson County. So my middle sister's homeplace was the frame house until we moved to my current home. Her name was Catheline. The Gooddrums were the last people I knew who owned it. We sold it and got a good price for it, but it was disappointing. (021)

My parents bought the home from a man named Procter. He was a doctor and had several children. He was not a relative. Dr. Will Procter was his name. He had two sons and at least two or three daughters.

The old log house is one of the oldest buildings in Simpson County. It is over 100 hundreds years old. The Mitchells lived there and then it was rented for awhile. The Phillips lived there, Mary and Lile. One of the Phillips daughters were born there. "It is an old, old house."

The Mitchells lived there when I lived out that way. They are the only ones I remember that ever lived there. Their names were Bill and Meallie Mitchell.

Before I moved into to town an artist came out and drew the house, I have a good picture of the house. It does not mean too much to me, except that "its been there ever since we were there." "I just remember that old house, always."

A bachelor whose wife left him, lived in the trailor in front of the log cabin. His name is Riley (Blue) Coleman. He has relatives in Franklin, Kentucky. He is still living. A storm blew his trailor away. He moved near Woodburn in another trailor. His daughter married a man with the last name Law and they live in Woodburn. He is probably in his early eighties. (067) His wife was named Cortez and they had one daughter in Woodburn area.

I was born in Warren County and moved to Simpson when I was 2 years old. [conversation about Margie Helm] My sister Catheline worked at the bank and Charline worked at the farm office. I taught school in Simpson County at the consolidated school on Morgantown Road for 30 something years. It was a nice community to work in, but things change.

Ben Procter lived across from Western, his house was torn down for a parking lot. It was a beautiful home. His house should have been restored for the president's home, but it was torn down. [looked at picture] (124)
