

I John M<sup>r</sup> Collock of the Parish of Belfast and County Antrim being of sound mind & Memory, do hereby make and publish this my Last Will & Testament, in Form and manner following;

I Leave and Bequeath to my Wife, & Son James, All my Farm of Land in the Townland of upper Ballysillon, and all the Houses & Stock thereon, To be Divided Equally between them Share & Share alike, And all the Household Furniture to my Wife, incumbering the Houses & Lands, in the following Manner —

I Leave my Son Adam one English Shilling —

I Leave to my Son John Ten pounds Ster. and to be upheld in every necessary till next Nov<sup>r</sup>, as he formerly had

I Leave to my Son Matthew Ten pounds Ster. and to be put to a Trade & Maintained in every necessary for three years the above to be paid of my Farm in upper Ballysillon —

I Leave to my Wife and her Heirs and Assigns all my Farm of Land in Ballycollin & Parish of Derraghry with the following incumbrance. —

I Leave to my Daughter Margaret Thirty pounds Sterling Provided the Lease lasts four years, if it do not last so long, Twenty pounds Ster. —

And I nominate and appoint James Steel of the Parish of Derraghry and my Wife to be my Executors —

And I hereby disannul all former and other Wills made by me, Ratifying & Confirming this and no other to be my Last Will & Testament. —

 debt of Three Hundred Pounds Sterling affecting said  
 said tenement the Profits of which concern is to be applied  
 towards the maintenance & Education of the said Children  
 untill they arrive at the age of twenty One years respectively  
 or be married but in no wise do I allow them or either  
 of them to sell the said tenement or any part thereof  
 I give & bequeath my Six Houses in Rosmary Lane  
 in the said town as possessed by John Clark, Miss Galloway  
 Mrs Turner, James Colville, James & Nancy Robert &  
 Alexander Gordon unto the Children of my Sister  
 Martha Graham in equal Shares of the profits thereof  
 to be applied towards their maintenance & Education  
 untill they arrive at the age of Twenty One years respectively  
 or be married but on no account do I allow them or  
 either of them to sell the said houses or any part  
 thereof I give & bequeath to the trustees or directors  
 of the Belfast Fever Hospital for the use of that  
 institution Thirty Pounds Sterling & to the Lying in Hospital  
 Thirty Pounds Sterling unto poor distressed room keepers  
 Widows & orphans in Belfast & its environs at the  
 discretion of my Executor I give & bequeath the sum of  
 Thirty pounds Sterling & to my Executors Ten Guineas  
 each for the trouble they may have in the execution  
 of this my will is and subject to my first debts &  
 Funeral Expences I give and bequeath to my Brother in  
 law James Graham & my said sister all the residue  
 of my Property my house hold furniture & wearing  
 apparel & I do hereby appoint Messrs James McTear  
 & Mr. Tucker both of the town of Belfast Merchants  
 to be Executors of this my last will In witness  
 whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this  
 Twenty third day of January in the year One Thousand  
 Eight Hundred & Ten
