ORGANIZATIONAL HISTORY

In 1940 the Southern Region Woman's Missionary Union of the Kentucky Baptist Convention voted to sponsor a camp for young people at a state park in Elkton, Kentucky. From 1940 to 1949 the Southern Region Young People's Camp met at Elkton, Logansport, Sulphur Well, and Morgantown while a permanent home for the camp was sought. In 1950 Brownsville Missionary Baptist Church purchased a site in Brownsville, Edmonson County, and gave it to the Southern Region WMU. In 1952 the first camp was held there. Subsequently, the name was changed to Camp Joy, reflecting the motto – **J**esus first, **O**thers second and **Y**our self last. The Southern Region WMU continued to oversee the camp until 1973 when the Baptist churches of Allen, Bethel, Edmonson, Freedom, Gasper River, Grayson, Liberty, Logan, Lynn, Monroe, Simpson, and Warren Associations assumed sponsorship.

The first dormitory was completed in 1953 and the open air Wells Chapel was built in 1955. In 1973 the Minnie Berry Lodge was dedicated to Baptist home missionary Berry of Franklin, Kentucky. Today Camp Joy's grounds include two dormitories, three lodges, a residence for the camp manager, a swimming pool, and other recreational facilities. It remains a place set apart for Bible study, reflection, and worship.

COLLECTION

This collection consists of documents related to the history of Camp Joy, a Baptist assembly located in Brownsville, Edmonson County, Kentucky, from 1951 to 1991. The materials include minutes of the camp trustees, executive committee, advisory board, and the Southern Region Woman's Missionary Union. The collection also includes By-laws, camp policies and regulations, financial reports, worship service and retreat programs, camper and parent information sheets, schedules of events, lists of campers, attendance reports, and miscellaneous correspondence. One folder contains the correspondence of Mrs. W.F. Ware (Martha) a long-time camp supporter and Southern Region WMU officer. Also, one folder contains two cash books for the years 1953 to 1957 maintained by Mrs. Mont Breedlove (Ila

Elizabeth), Camp Joy treasurer. Of interest are two color postcards from the 1960s showing views of the camp at that time.
